Now onto the business of TCI: There are ten things on my mind that I will mention in this letter as I believe they are important to the health of TCI, including members at large. I will expand on some of these items as time goes on and into the next TCI year (it starts in September).

The Delegates at this year's convention have spoken and are looking to me to stay in the President seat for another 2 years. This term, I intend to make sure that all of you are "in the TCI game". I want you to rekindle the spirit and excitement that brought you into the Tall Club game in the first place. You were obviously attracted to Kae's dream, and NOW is the time to re-energize your passion for Tall Clubs. If you have had a bad TCI experience, I want you to give us another try.

We all, as members, need to join forces and kick TCI back into a positive growing organization. TCI was built on the backs of member clubs, so you who are Members-at-Large, some of this will apply, and some will not. To grow and re-invigorate TCI – it will take each one of you. I know that some of your clubs are suffering, and some are doing well. I would like to encourage each of you to find a revitalized life in your club.

Here are 10 items for success and revitalization of YOUR Club and TCI along with some general information on what is going on in TCI as we move into the next year

1. Successful format and the future of TCI Conventions.

If you have attended a convention in the past, GREAT! If it not or it has been a while since you have, maybe it's time to try anew. Most of you know convention as the gathering of Talls getting together in big cities. Convention formats have consisted of tourism as a group, bus rides to great attractions, formal dinners and late-night afterhours. Well, a lot of that changed this year. The days were not formally planned for daytime activities, everything was informal, and the typical after-hours parties changed to going to a commercial establishment or gathering in common area(s) of the hotel. 3. The future of the "Miss TI" program workshop – Convention – 2024

Without candidates this year, we will not, for the first time in many years, have a Miss TI.

We had a discussion group at convention that discussed this subject. Everyone was encouraged to attend whether you were for or against the program. It was a consensus, that the program has outlived its lifetime in its current format.

An Ambassador program may be the answer to make something like this work again and to have a spokesperson to represent TCI. What is that reality? how will it work? What will it do? How will it be enacted? These are all questions that I intend to investigate with you over the next few months and building up to our next convention.

4. Communications and information exchange – do we have your proper club information?

- One issue we have is communication with clubs and members of your club. When TCI sends you a message, we aren't even sure that you are getting the message.
- When someone visits tall.org, and wants information on your club, are you getting the message? ARE YOU RESPONDING?
- Also, TCI is sending out a Talkin' Tall message. **TCI wants each of your club members to see this message in its entirety.** We often hear about club members who have never seen this publication. How can the message to TCI members get to its members if it is not sent to them?

5. Where is Convention 2025?

Good Question. And once again this year, I don't have an answer.

We need clubs and committees to create opportunities for TCI to have conventions. We have people who have run conventions and have experience in putting them together. They will be more than happy to bestow their wealth of information on anyone or any group willing to step up.

6. The age of COVID.

If you have been following Facebook, you are likely aware that once again, we had members contract COVID at the 2024 convention. It is interesting that the 202one convention in Louisville had no reported COVID cases. Yet, in 2022, 2023 and 2024, there were members who contracted it. I will not attempt to make any case for you to attend or not to attend a Convention or any of your local events as it relates to COVID. All I can say is that you should take care of yourself and make up your own mind. If you have pre-existing conditions or other conditions that might be adversely affected by COVID or have had a significant reaction to COVID then you'll want to consider your options and make the best decision for yourself. Unfortunately, COVID is likely here to stay.

7. The Delegate Meeting.

I'm not going to discuss the delegate meeting in this newsletter format. Your club delegate or proxy should have that information by now and it is their responsibility to disseminate that to your club.

8. Tall Topix 2023 (Alaskan Cruise Convention)

I know that Tall Topix 2023 is late. The editor had run into issues and will not be able to complete it. Nancy Jacoby has stepped up to take over the creation of the 2023 Tall Topix. Please include times, dates, and the names of those who are in the pictures.

9. How do I get the new contact information for the officers each year?

With upgrades to our website, we will be creating a standardized email system. Whereas the titles and format has not been set yet, every president for every year will have the same email address that gets forwarded to his/her personal email. The same will hold true for all other TCI officers. I look forward to this change in the coming months.

10. Why are you still sitting on the sidelines and not revitalizing your club right now?????? I want each club to have AT LEAST one event a month. How can you be a club with no events?

TCI membership has been dropping for years. LET'S TURN THAT AROUND! I'm excited about the possibilities in the coming year. I strongly encourage all of you to talk to me about your concerns and ideas.




