Now, let's address some common guestions about the TCI Convention:

- Who organizes a convention?
 - A convention is coordinated by a team, typically comprising 3-4 members or more to minimize stress on each person. Many experienced TCI members are available to assist or offer guidance.
- Why is the TCI Convention held during the week of the 4th of July?
 - We often choose business hotels because they provide better rates due to lower occupancy during the holiday. Business hotels also have banquet facilities and more rooms to accommodate our needs, along with staff experienced in handling conventions. However, it's not mandatory to hold it at a business hotel; we have also used nonbusiness hotels.
- When can a TCI convention take place?
 - Ideally, the TCI Convention should be scheduled between May and July. From a business perspective, July is as late as we prefer, as the TCI business year concludes in August, and preparations for the new year must be completed by September.
- Who covers the costs?
 - The straightforward answer is that all attendees contribute. The bylaws permit a profit, which is returned to the organizing club and TCI.
- When must a TCI Convention be approved?
 - Most conventions are organized a little over a year in advance

A basic plan should be approved by the delegates, ideally during a prior convention. There are certainly options and alternatives to what I've outlined here. If you have any questions or need further information, please feel free to reach out to me, and I will do my best to answer your questions, respond to your concerns and point you in the right direction.

Nominations are now open for TCI Merit Awards for 2024/2025. The purpose of the Merit Award is to acknowledge members of your club who have gone the extra mile to support your club and/or TCI.

Nominations must be submitted by 6/15/25.

As defined in the TCI Bylaws, Section 8.1H, "Up to twelve (12) Merit Awards shall be presented annually to individuals in TCI. Each Club can submit two (2) nominees from its membership, and the Executive Board may nominate two (2) additional candidates from throughout TCI, including MALs. Nomination forms and instructions should be available for download from the Members section of Tall.org at least four (4) months prior to the annual Convention. A Merit Award recipient can receive additional Merit Awards. However, they shall not be given to the same recipient in consecutive years. The Alternate Executive Officer shall be responsible to purchase the awards.

A fillable copy of the nomination form is included on the next page. Complete the form, either on-line or by hard copy, and include detailed information about the candidate. In order to give fair assessment to each individual, it is essential to include dates and a descriptions of leadership positions held and events credited to the member. In addition, do not reveal the identity of your nominee on this form— as recipients are selected anonymously! The Great Reno Balloon Races

Friday, September 5—Sunday, September 7, 2025



Friday we will attend the International Camel & Ostrich Races in historic Virginia City, NV. The camels, ostriches, zebras and good old-fashioned family fun returns this year for the 66th annual International Camel & Ostrich Races. This hilarious and family-favorite tradition started as a prank between two newspaper editors, and 66 years later it remains as silly and fun as its origin.
