TCI Elections: Get Involved and Help Shape the Future

Hello everyone,

In this edition, I'd like to share some important information about the upcoming elections for TCI offices.

Each year, TCI holds elections for half of the positions on our Executive Board, as outlined in our bylaws (Section 6.1). All officers serve two-year terms. In 2025—an odd-numbered year—the following positions will be up for election:

- Vice President/Membership
- Finance Officer
- Secretary
- Miss TI Coordinator
- Alternate Treasurer

Let's take a moment to walk through what each role involves:

Vice President/Membership

This person maintains our membership records, works with clubs to gather membership and officer rosters, and partners with the Treasurer to track dues from clubs and Members-at-Large. They also review and process applications for Member-at-Large membership.

Finance Officer

The Finance Officer oversees TCI's budget—creating, monitoring, and ensuring our financial activity aligns with organizational goals. This role works closely with the Treasurer to maintain accurate and up-to-date records and evaluate necessary expenses and income.

Secretary

The Secretary is responsible for documenting Executive Board and Delegate meetings, posting approved minutes to the website, and updating the bylaws as needed. Clear communication and attention to detail are key in this role.



Miss TI Coordinator

While we won't have a Miss TI this year, this role presents a meaningful opportunity to reimagine the program. I'd love for the new Coordinator to explore fresh ideas or revisit past approaches to create a version of Miss TI that resonates with today's members and carries us forward.

Alternate Treasurer

This person should have financial experience and be prepared to step in for the Treasurer if needed. They also conduct audits of convention financial records, which means they may serve on a convention committee and audit their own committee's books.

These are the offices that will officially be on the ballot at this year's convention. However, if any current board members choose to step down, additional positions may open up—so stay tuned.

Interested in getting more involved? This is a great opportunity to make a meaningful contribution to TCI. If you're curious about any of these positions or thinking about running, I'd love to talk with you. Just send me an email.

Nominations are now open for TCI Merit Awards for 2024/2025. The purpose of the Merit Award is to acknowledge members of your club who have gone the extra mile to support your club and/or TCI.

Nominations must be submitted by 6/15/25.

As defined in the TCI Bylaws, Section 8.1H, "Up to twelve (12) Merit Awards shall be presented annually to individuals in TCI. Each Club can submit two (2) nominees from its membership, and the Executive Board may nominate two (2) additional candidates from throughout TCI, including MALs. Nomination forms and instructions should be available for download from the Members section of Tall.org at least four (4) months prior to the annual Convention. A Merit Award recipient can receive additional Merit Awards. However, they shall not be given to the same recipient in consecutive years. The Alternate Executive Officer shall be responsible to purchase the awards.

A fillable copy of the nomination form is included on the next page. Complete the form, either on-line or by hard copy, and include detailed information about the candidate. In order to give fair assessment to each individual, it is essential to include dates and a descriptions of leadership positions held and events credited to the member. In addition, do not reveal the identity of your nominee on this form— as recipients are selected anonymously! Place the name in a separate, sealed envelope with the name of your club on the outside, and staple it to the nomination sheet.
